
We jumped on our bikes and headed off along the Hume Highway, and from here most of us turned off along Picton, while Barry headed back north.



## **BOB THE BAPTIST**

#### Sunbeams and Stepthroughs

Dad, known to many as Bob the Baptist, has a firmly established priority for the things he loves in or about life, an unshakable love for and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. A never-ending love for Mum and an unfailing love for his children, my brother John, his wife Anne, myself and wife Deb, and our children Beck, Josh, Ethan and Caleb. However Bob the Baptist also has a love for things mechanical and automotive. That at times has included motorcycles. For the most part Dad has shown his greatest interest in cars, particularly Sunbeams. This unusual habit has reached to Sunbeam motorbikes, scooters and even bicycles.

The first Sunbeam bike I remember was an \$7 or \$8. To me it was a marvellous thing compared to the bikes I had seen. It seemed enormous and I recall that I was amazed by the tyres. They were wider than the Mini 850 Dad had driven home from work, and it had "fatties" on it too! I don't recall if that old dinosaur ever turned a wheel while we owned it.

Sunbeam No. 2 was a thing of aesthetic beauty and to me the bike that all motorcycles of truly classic nature were measured against. Slightly worn chrome tank with black panels and gold lettering, unregistered, but with the air of a motorcycle of distinction, a 500cc high cam single. As beautiful as it appeared, I don't think it ran when Bob the Baptist purchased it. Dad being Dad, set about reversing this situation. After tinkering, fettling and generally getting covered in that lovely old bike grit, grime and oil, he felt it was time to give it a kick.

Now, something you must understand is that there were no basketballers in our family, (until recently anyway), in fact, mostly we Armstrong men are downright "vertically challenged"! As well as the vertically challenged thing, Dad has been fairly slight of build. Now these facts never crossed his mind as he primed the bike with a gentle arc of the leg to find compression. (for the benefit of the young, that is to use a kick start pedal. Ed.) then lifted himself well clear of the sprung saddle, pivoted off those shiny handle bars and threw his whole weight down on the kick lever with the tenacity of a Bantam Rooster (whoops, BSA's will try and get in anywhere they can). With a throaty woof the Sunbeam partly fired. With a throaty roar, Bob the Baptist was launched over the handle bars and into a pile of bits and pieces against the wall of our back shed.

Despite this experience, I do not think my dad had ever thrown a bike down the road. That is until Dad brought home the "Green Monster". Please don't be misled, this was no Triton type hybrid or even a replica of some successful race machine. This was a metal flaked green, vellow pin-striped, step-through of Japanese persuasion.

This was a useful tool in Bob the Baptist economy stakes and seemed to be used in two basic ways. It's main function was to convey Dad to his job in Katoomba as a car sales manager. Of course this required suitable apparel, a neat brown suit, shirry shoes with the unfashionable but mandatory addition of a "pudding basin" helmet with peak attached. The second use Dad had for this amazing piece of machinery was that of trail, trials, and scrambler machine for after work. Dad would boot about the old fire trails across from our home at Shipley. Brother John and I would often tear after him on our push-bikes. Sometimes we would come mighty close to catching him. On one occasion John and I were putting the long ones, red faced, tongues hanging out. It seemed, as we closed on him that we might actually catch Dad, until we came to a small rise over which Dad had a bit more pace. Not to be deterred, we pressed on, we crested the rise and came to near disaster. We grabbed copious amounts of brake while trying to control our desire to fall all over the ground laughing as we caught sight of Dad, face down in a bottle brush tree, fully equipped with brown salesman suit, shiny shoes and the ever faithful "pudding basin". The green monster languished, still running by the trail.

To my knowledge, there have been no other incidents of this nature in Bob the Baptist's motorcycling past. But with a D5 Bantam and a Sunbeam Scooter in his elastic sided shed, the possibilities seem endless, don't they?!
