CMA Back Patches

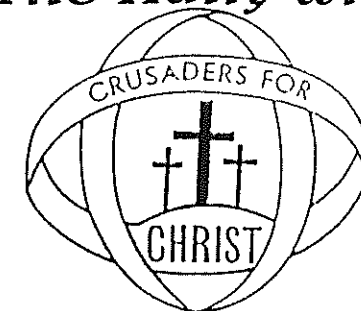
The subject of CMA Back Patches was brought up at the National Run meeting last November and after much discussion at the last committee meeting the following motion was unanimously carried:

Howard is the manager of the Salvation Army Community Welfare department in Newcastle.

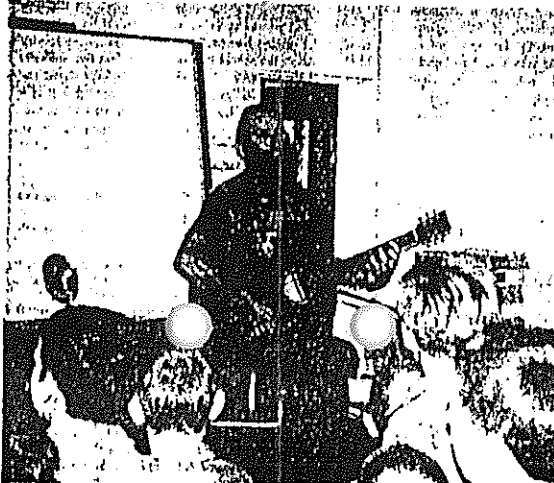

EDITORS RAMBLE

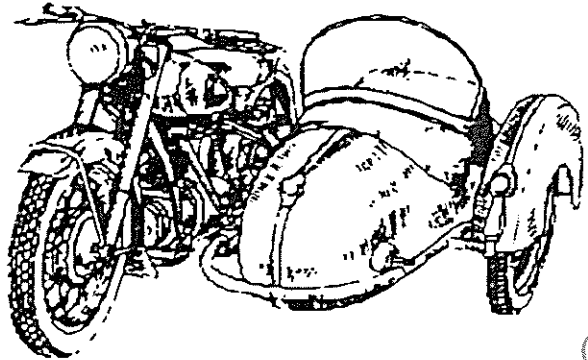


was out riding the other day with some mates, when over a period of time one cylinder, and then another stopped firing, which is specially worrying when you've only got three to start with! The inevitable happened and we stopped. It would only run on one cylinder, and only at idle. Off home on the trailer we go, yet again. Problem: Output wire from rectifier broken off. Effect: Battery not being charged, no spark.

As I was considering this phenomenon, I thought about our Christian life. What happens when our life's "battery" doesn't get that spiritual "charge" from God? When the wire breaks what happens? It's then that we go flat, lose our spiritual spark, start running on less and less cylinders. Maybe we even stop altogether. And I tell you- we need each other. Let's keep our charge up.



Who guessed the bike then? I didn't hear from anyone, too old for youse all? It's a BMW R25/3 (250cc single) with Steib LS200 lightweight sidecar of early '50s vintage, my previous mount (minus sidecar).
